Funding from the History Department has created an opportunity for an internship in the History Department. The successful candidate will work with Dr Markus Daechsel supporting his current research project on the intellectual history of international development over the 20th century. This work will feed into major grant applications, including ongoing plans for a research workshop in India in March/April 2020.

Position: Intellectual History Project

Main Responsibilities:

1. To carry out statistical textual research on digitised databases.
2. To compile bibliographies from national and international archive and library catalogues.
3. To assist the lead researcher in the organisation of a pilot workshop.

The successful candidate will be a current Royal Holloway undergraduate student and have an interest in international history and global development. They will have excellent research skills with an eye for detail, excellent written communication skills, and an ability to use state-of-the-art digital note-taking and data management. Reading knowledge of a European language other than English is desirable but not essential. Familiarity with Papers and EndNote referencing software is also an advantage, but on-the-job training will be provided.

Hours:

It is currently expected that the total of 40 working hours will be divided into one working day per week (7 hours) over five weeks in semesters 2 and 3, plus five additional hours for e-mail communications when the need arises. Arrangements are flexible and can be tailored to suit the successful candidate's timetable.
